



Note: Between A.D. 351 and 476 a series of invasions by barbaric tribes from Europe completely overran the Western Roman Empire and brought it to its end. The tribes included the Saxons (English), the Franks (French), the Alemanni (Germans), the Burgundians (Swiss), the Lombards (Italians), the Visigoths (Spanish), the Suevi (Portuguese), the Vandals, the Ostrogoths, and the Heruli.

The Bible says: "They shall not _____."

Note: The simple statement, "They shall not cleave one to another," has stood for fifteen hundred years, from Rome's fall to today, as a constant witness to the truth and reliability of God's Word. During the centuries many men have attempted to unite Europe politically. Such leaders as Charlemagne, Charles V, Louis XIV, Napoleon, and Hitler have had such a dream and failed. Daniel's seven words assure

aranatha began in 1968 with a group of students in a high school near Orlando, Florida. To the teen-agers it seemed that their world had to a great extent lost all meaning and purpose. The death of former classmates in a controversial war appeared useless. To them it looked as if history's greatest lesson was that men had always used the best of their resources of mind and material to develop better ways to destroy themselves.

Would killing never come to an end? Were all youth imprisoned on a planet where most of the inhabitants would always live in grinding poverty, where overpopulation would bring death by famine to hundreds of millions of people, where pollution would eventually blot out the beauty of their heritage?

In their search for meaning the Orlando students turned to the Bible. Was it possible, they wondered, that the ancient Book had fore-told the future and held the only key to hope for man? They knew that no other book in history had caused the controversy it had. For thousands of years men had pondered, argued, and many times fought over what it said. No other book made the claims it did with such authority. Turning to the Bible, the Florida teen-agers read its challenge to modern man: "Remember the former things of old: for I am God, and there is none else; I am God, and there is none like me, declaring the end from the beginning, and from ancient times the things that are not yet done, saying, My counsel shall stand, and I will do all my pleasure." Isaiah 46:9, 10.

Those young adults accepted the challenge and determined to decide for themselves if God spoke through the Bible to the space age. Their study centered in the messages of the three angels of Revelation 14:6-12. But what did the symbols in the passage mean? Who or what was "Babylon"? What were "the beast" and the "mark of the beast"?

In the following twelve lessons you will study these same messages for yourself. Please understand that at no time during the twelve studies will anyone pressure you or even ask you to join a church. Maranatha's purpose is twofold: (1) to give you the opportunity of deciding for yourself if the Bible is relevant to today's problems, (2) to give you the opportunity to study from the Bible alone the last message we believe God will give this planet. Work on these lesson guides at your own pace. We do suggest that you finish one lesson a week, and it is best to set aside a definite time to do them.

The first three study guides will give an overview of what the Bible predicts about the end of the world as background for the three angels' messages of Revelation 14. From there we go directly into the third

angel's message in Lesson 4, the warning about the "mark of the beast" in Revelation 14:9-12. The first angel's message, Revelation 14:6, 7, and the second angel's message, Revelation 14:8, will follow.

Note: In the dream God outlined world history from the days of Nebuchadnezzar to its end. By the symbolism of different metals in the image, He revealed that four world empires would eventually arise. History reveals that they were Babylon (head of gold), Medo-Persia (chest and arms of silver), Greece (thighs of brass), and Rome (legs of iron).
