


No. 10 THE FIRST ANGEL'S MESSAGE—Part II YOUR DAY IN COURT

Man naturally fears judgment. All of us have had the uneasy sensation that comes with being appraised. A school examination, appearance in traffic court, work evaluation by a supervisor, all represent just a few of the experiences which may have caused us apprehension and concern.

The thought of God's judgment has struck fear in many hearts. Yet, the Bible tells us that we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ. We have no way to escape our day in court. The question we must answer is, Are we ready to stand before the bar of justice and hear the verdict?

The righteous, on the other hand, show by the fruitage of their lives that the Lord rules them. The way that they now live, they live by the power that God imparts to them through the presence of Christ. He bore the guilt of our sins and mistakes upon the cross of Calvary. We will stand before God as though we had never sinned. Gone will be our record of mistakes. 

In Paul's day the judgment was still future. (Acts 24:25.) When Christ comes, His reward is with Him, that is, the judgment is over. We are now in the judgment period, according to the Books of Daniel and the Revelation. God is examining the cases of those who have accepted Christ. He will cleanse those who have triumphed over their fallen natures through His power. But those who have claimed to be Christians, yet by their lives have denied their Lord, will have their names removed from the book of life.

Perhaps you inquire, "If we are saved by grace, what part will our good deeds play in our salvation?" They indicate the completeness of our surrender, but they will not compensate for our sins. Many have a form of godliness but by their acts deny the power of God in their lives. These will not enter heaven. Their actions testify that they were Christians in name only.

Christ described such people in Matthew 7:21-23: "Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven. Many will say to me in that day, Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in thy
