nd there followed another angel, saying, Babylon is fallen, is fallen, that great city, because she made all nations drink of the wine of the wrath of her fornication." Revelation 14:8.

When one reads this text, an obvious question comes to mind: Who or what is Babylon? Certainly a city by that name existed on the Euphrates River in the Mesopotamian Valley. But the ancient literal city already lay largely in ruins in the days of John, the author of the Revelation. The word *Babylon* must have some significance in the Bible other than being the name of an abandoned city. We shall see, as in so

many instances in Revelation, that the term has a special meaning apart from the literal one. A clue to its significance appears in the name itself.

In Babylonian the name *Bab-ilu* (Babel, or Babylon) meant "gate of the gods," and reflects the claim of the Babylonian kings that divine mandate had commissioned them to rule the world. Actually, Nimrod had founded the city, and from its beginning it was emblematic of disbelief in the true God and defiance of His will. (Genesis 11:4-9.) Read the passage, and you will find that the tower of Babel was a monument to apostasy, a citadel of rebellion against the Ruler of the universe.

Two more words in the message of the second angel have great significance: *fornication* and *wine*. Fornication, as used in prophecy, denotes turning away from God, spiritual apostasy. (Ezekiel 16:2, 15.) Wine has reference to the lies or false teachings the apostasy has as its basis. (Micah 2:11.)

We go now to the Scriptures to find the meaning for modern man in the statement "Babylon is fallen."
