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

n Lesson 4 we discovered that God is holding the closing events of the earth's history in check until His servants are sealed. We saw that the symbols describing the seal of God and the "mark of the beast" are similar. Further, we shall discover, as we begin to identify the beast in this lesson, that just as the seal of God appears in His law, so the mark or seal of the beast involves God's law—its alteration. We now turn our attention to the question, "Who is the beast?"

In answering this question we will use the Bible and recorded history. As we have seen in the prophecies already studied, God has given us in the Bible the keys needed to unlock their mysteries. The Biblical guidelines, combined with close scrutiny of the pages of history, are all

word translated "time" means "year," and in this case the period under study would amount to $3\frac{1}{2}$ years used in a prophetic sense. Revelation 12:6, 14 equate the same $3\frac{1}{2}$ times or years to 1260 days. (Dividing 1260 days by $3\frac{1}{2}$ shows that a prophetic year consists of 360 days; dividing 360 by 12 indicates that a prophetic month equals 30 days.) Using the year-day principle of prophetic reckoning out-

lined in Ezekiel 4:6 (OT 652) and Numbers 14:34 (OT 138), we can see that the $3\frac{1}{2}$ times, or 1260 prophetic days, is really a period of 1260 literal *years* during which the little horn would dominate Europe.

For a few minutes, by means of Bible symbolism, you have watched a prophetic drama. Nations, represented by different animals, have appeared before you briefly and have faded. The prophecy has focused on one power in particular, the little horn. A number of clues indicate its identity. One in particular is startling.

This power would "think" to change times and *laws*. Evidently the prophet is thinking of divine laws, inasmuch as those in authority can change human laws at will—something that one would naturally expect. But to change God's law is a serious matter. The major law that God has given to mankind is the Ten Commandments. So important is it that, as we found in Lesson 4, God has placed in it His seal. The commandments are an expression of His will, the principles He operates the universe on. You can see that it would be a daring act for any

Note: The prophecy clearly points out the time and the place for the rise into prominence of the "little horn." Time: The "little horn" would appear sometime after A.D. 476, following the breakup of the Roman Empire. Place: It would develop in Western Europe among the territories of the ten horns, and would uproot three of the kingdoms in its rise to power.






